


Today is Palm Sunday and we begin with the Solemn blessing of Psalms and a gospel from Matthew about the

event. He has Jesus approaching Jerusalem by way of the Mount of Olives and asks two disciples to bring a donkey with its foal. With these details, MT signals what is about to happen points to the fulfillment of prophecy and of Israel's greatest hope. Zechariah proclaimed that at the culmination of God's plan, the Lord would stand upon the Mount of Olives and that God's anointed would arrive "riding on a donkey." (Zechariah 14:4; 9:9).

Our first reading from Isaiah is the third of four poems commonly called the "Servant Songs." The servant is described as one sent from God with divine power, but rejected by the people and forced to suffer. In ancient Israel, having an "open ear" was one way to describe an ideal servant or slave. In other words, a true servant of God is one who continually hears and responds to the divine voice. Though subject to beatings and humiliation, he places total trust in God knowing that he will ultimately enjoy God's vindication.

Our second reading, incorporated into the Letter to the Philippians about thirty years after the death of Jesus, was most likely an alreadyexisting hymn and expresses very early understandings of the mystery of Christ. At the time of his letter, Paul is in prison, perhaps facing death. In the hymn, Jesus, like every human being, bore the "form of God," but unlike the First Adam, did not grasp at equality with God. Instead, in humble obedience and self-giving love, he "emptied himself" of life, serving God's purpose like a slave. Because of this God raises him up to the status of "Lord."

In our reading of the Passion from Matthew, we again encounter the Servant of the Lord in Jesus. Only MT will tell us that Judas was paid thirty pieces of silver and only MT presents a scene of Judas' regret and suicide. When he attempts to

return the money, Jewish leaders object. Blood money cannot be added to the temple treasury so it is used to buy a cemetery. While MT's account of the Last Supper is very similar to MK & LK, only MT will tell us that Jesus gives his life "for the forgiveness of sins." Only MT will tell us that in the garden, Jesus prays "Father...your will be done," a fulfillment of Isaiah 53:10. Only MT will have Jesus call Judas "friend" in the garden. And only MT tells us that Jesus says all of this must happen "in order that the Scriptures be fulfilled." Only MT will echo Daniel's vision of end-of-time events: earthquakes, tombs opening, the dead raised (Dan. 12:2). And, finally, only MT will tell us that the chief priests and Pharisees ask Pilate for a guard on Jesus' tomb, let his followers steal the body and claim he has been raised.

Good things do happen!!!! We have to replace the boiler in the rectory. Because of the size of the building (almost 12,000 square feet) we need a sizeable boiler to keep it heated. Estimated costs are in the neighborhood of \$25,000 to \$30,000! Though we have a contingency fund to help with emergencies such as this. I hate to see it depleted, but it's going to happen. And then along came a knight in shining armor in the person of parishioner Chip Wachter, a partner in the Kidder Wachter Architectural Firm. They have just sold a large building they own in downtown Erie and it has a new boiler which they have to remove. Chip and his engineer were here to determine if the boiler would work in the rectory, and it's a perfect fit!!! His people are working on determining how to disconnect it from its present sight and install it in the basement of the rectory, and we'll do that once the weather breaks. The only costs we will incur will be those involved with the move and installation. I know you join me in thanking the Kidder Wachter Firm for their generosity to the parish which results in a savings of probably \$25,000.

With the installation of this new boiler, the rectory is finally up to date. We have new central air conditioning, all new wiring, new plumbing and now a new heating system. All of the windows on the first and third floors are being replaced and the last of those will be done as soon as the weather breaks. We still have about 10 windows to finish on the second floor, and then we're done. It's been a long couple of years getting the building to where it should be; but now we can see the end. If you have never been through the rectory and would like to see it sometime, just call and I'll be happy to show it to you. It's an amazing building with 34 rooms, 10 bathrooms, 12 working fireplaces, all inside walls are 18 inch thick brick, a hundred year old functioning elevator and a hundred year old functioning steam room!!!

If you have not yet made a pledge to the 2017 Catholic Services Appeal, can I ask that you consider doing so? We have to raise \$74,000 for our assessment and any excess funds raised will go toward the restoration of our pipe organ. The Finance Council and Parish Council met jointly this past week to hear a presentation on the extent of the work to the pipe organ. Our hope is to do this work over a period of five years so that we will not have to conduct a capital campaign to finance it but can do so with the excess from the CSA and other projects.

The Parish Office will be closed Thursday and Friday of this week in observance of Holy Thursday and Good Friday. Please also remember that there is no 5 PM Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday. The Vigil Mass cannot take place until after sundown and in the Diocese of Erie cannot begin before 8:30 PM this year. On Easter Sunday we will have music by the choir accompanied by the pipe organ, trumpet, kettle drum and bagpipes at both the Easter Vigil and the Sunday 10:30 AM Mass.

This happened at the Sunset Convalescent Home where residents have small apartments but eat in the dining room. One morning Fred didn't show up for breakfast so a friend went to check on him. She could hear him through the door and he said he would be right down. An hour later he had still not arrived so she went looking again and found him coming down the stairs but having a terrible time. He had a death grip on the hand rail and was having trouble getting his legs to work right. She wanted to call an ambulance but he said he wasn't in pain and just wanted breakfast. She helped him the rest of the way and he had his breakfast. When he tried to go back to his room, he couldn't even get up so they called an ambulance. A few hours later they called the hospital to see how he was doing. The receptionist said he was fine, he just had both of his legs in one leg of his boxer shorts.
