



From the Pastor's Desk...

Today is the high point of the church year as we celebrate the resurrection of Christ and the conquering of death for all



of us. Normally our first reading comes from the Old Testament, but during the Easter season it comes from Acts of the Apostles. Luke finishes his gospel with the Ascension and then begins writing Acts of the Apostles with the Feast of Pentecost until Paul. It is the only record we have of that early church. In Peter's speech on the occasion of the baptism of Cornelius. Luke narrates when and how Christianity opened to the Gentiles as well as Jews. During the speech, the Holy Spirit descends upon everyone present. The Jewish believers are astounded that God's gifts are given also to persons who are not of the chosen race. Peter stresses that God's message is sent first to Israel, then to a smaller group of witnesses to reach the people of Israel and that the message is universal.

In Colossians we read that by baptism the Christian becomes a sharer in the Lord's death and resurrection. This brings with it not only the commitment to renounce sin and walk in a new life, but also an orientation to the heavenly realities, sustained by the awareness of our own identity as God's adopted children. The baptized Christian makes a conscious effort to "seek what is above, where Christ is seated at God's right hand," while adopting an attitude of detachment from mere earthly things. We are also assured that "when Christ in our life appears, then you shall appear with him in glory."

In John's gospel there is a "seeing" that does not produce faith and another "seeing" that does. The beloved disciple's faith reaches beyond appearances and penetrates the inner dimension and meaning. It is a look of love that enables the disciple to see beyond the material evidence and believe that Jesus rose from the dead. Mary senses something and goes to the tomb. John is clever with details. His report is intriguing, and what it means is eloquent. Mary saw the stone

removed from the tomb. The heavy stone, impossible for her to move by herself, no longer presents an obstacle. The stone that would not allow entry into those secret regions of life suddenly is not there. Mary does not approach the grave, but ran to report the news: "The Lord has been taken from the tomb." She doesn't refer to an inert body, but to a living being. Christ is alive.

Might I wish each of you and blessed and holy Easter, and I hope you get to celebrate the day with family and friends. Thank you also for your generous gifts for all of the flowers, etc., in the church.

The Parish Office will be closed on Easter Monday.

A new Gallup poll shows that more than a third of U. S. Catholics (37%) - surveyed in January and February—said they have questioned whether they should remain in the church. That's up from 22 percent in 2002 when The Boston Globe published its report detailing widespread child sex abuse by priests in that city as well as the coverup by Cardinal Law. Frequent churchgoers were less likely than other Catholics to say they are rethinking their affiliation with the faith this year. Only 22 percent of Catholics who attend church weekly today said they have considered leaving the faith compared with 37 percent of those who attend nearly weekly or monthly and 46 percent of those who seldom or never attend. I don't think the men who did these despicable things and the bishops who covered it up have a clue to the damage they have done both to innocent lives and to the church itself. Everyone of them should be in prison.

Australia has just witnessed the conviction of Cardinal Pell for abusing minors and its effect on the church is devastating. In the 1970s, 74 percent of Australian Catholics attended Mass weekly. In 2011, only 12 percent went to Mass periodically (not even weekly). The decline is attributed directly to the highhanded approach of Cardinal Pell when he was archbishop of Melbourne as he led the church in fighting gay rights and same sex marriage and then is convicted of doing the very crimes he says he is condemning. As ugly as all of this is, we're better off in the truth than in the

lies and cover ups of the past.

The German bishops recently announced a binding "synodal process" on celibacy, sexual morality and a reduction of clerical power. The bishops said that the results would lead to a binding but as yet undetermined outcome thus involving lay people in decision making in the church. Cardinal Marx, head of the German bishops conference, told journalists the church's teaching on sexual morality has yet to account for significant recent discoveries from theology and the humanities. Also, he said, the significance of sexuality to personhood has not yet received sufficient attention from the church. He sees priestly celibacy as an "expression of the religious bond to God" and do not want to give up on it. But to what extent celibacy should always be an element of priestly witness is a question "we will determine" through the synodal process. Furthermore, Marx said clerical abuse of power constitutes a betraval of the trust of people in need of stability and religious orientation. Therefore, the synodal process would be charged with identifying what measures must be taken to achieve "the necessary reduction of clerical power."

We're not going to overcome our problems in the church until we completely rethink the power structure. As it is now, one man can make or break a parish; one man can make or break an entire diocese. Lay people, and particularly women, have no voice in the decision making process of the church. No matter how much we decry clericalism, we will continue to be an "old boys club" until we change the decision-making process. I simply don't understand why we're so afraid of women. There seems to be clear evidence that women were deacons in the early church; why not now?

While my friend Cheryl was working as a receptionist for an eye surgeon, a very angry woman stormed up to her desk. "Someone stole my wig while I was having surgery yesterday," she complained. The doctor came out and tried to calm her down. "I assure you no one on my staff would have done such a thing," he said. "Why do you think it was taken here?" "After the operation, I noticed the wig I had on was ugly and cheaplooking." "I think," explained the surgeon gently, "that means your cataract operation was a success."
